Welcome to Whitehall Nursery and Infant School newsletter!!

Time keeping and attendance

Time keeping is very important for a good start to your child's day. This allows them to come into school with their friends and be ready to learn. When a child is late it can be upsetting for them arriving and not knowing what is expected of them. It also disrupts the rest of the class and the teacher.

The table alongside high lights how much learning time can be lost with persistent lateness over the academic year. As you can see this really mounts up!! School gates will open for Reception and main school at 8.20am. By doing this children are given the opportunity to have a few minutes to chat with their friends on the playground before the start of their day. Year 1 and 2 parents/carers can inform staff on the gate that they have brought their child onto the playground if they need to leave before 8.30am.

5 minutes late each day	3 days lost

15 minutes late each day	10 days lost
20 minutes late each day	13 days lost
30 minutes late each day	19 days lost



We would like to remind parents/carers that school closes at 3.30pm. Gates open at 3.20 for parent/carers to enter the playground. Parents/carers must be ready to collect their child by 3.30 unless they are attending 'after school' activities which finishes at 4.20pm. Parent/carers must contact the school office if they are going to be late or if someone else is collecting on your behalf. Remember to share your password with your nominated adult!! This also allows us the opportunity to reassure your child someone is on the way to collect them. Parents/carers are advised that should a child not be collected by 4pm and where no contact with the parent/carer can be made that School have a duty of care to notify Children's Services .

Behaviour

Message from Mr Palmer:

"We have been very sad to see some disrespectful behaviour coming from children towards teachers, teaching assistants and Lunchtime supervisors. We would encourage you to chat to your children at home and remind them that they need to respect all members of staff in school. This means listening to the adult and following their instructions, not ignoring the member of staff and especially not arguing back. If we work together at home and at school we can help our children R.O.A.R at Whitehall. The first R of R.O.A.R stands for **Respect**—you can ask your child about that 'R' and what it means, and remind them that it means respect for themselves, their friends, their teachers, TAs, Lunchtime Supervisors and office staff."

School Uniform

Children should be wearing their school uniform, every day, unless they have PE or have won class attendance. You will always be sent a letter to tell you if it is a non uniform day.

PE days are as follows: Reception Wednesday, Year 1 Tuesday, Year 2 Monday.

Our school uniform policy can be found on the school website. As the warmer weather (hopefully!!) will be with us soon, all school uniform including jackets/coats should have your child's name clearly written on them. This makes it so much easier to return the right clothing to the right child!! Click on the QR code to take you directly to the uniform page on the Website.

us which is free to anyone in need of it. The school uniform rail is situated at the bottom of the stairs leading to the school office. Please help yourselves.

School Meals

We understand some children may not like to try school dinners for a variety of reasons. Here at school we would like to continue to give the children the op-

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portunity to try them and suggest you take a look at the school menu (on the school website) with your child and chat about what is on offer to them. This may identify something they are familiar with and generate an interest in trying these foods in school.

A pack lunch can always be brought in as a back up in case they don't like their meal. If this is the case please speak with your class teacher and let them know.
