

If you would like to book a place on this workshop please let Mrs Ware know as **numbers are limited**.


Attendance Matters

LATE ARRIVAL/COLLECTING EARLY

When your child arrives late at school, he/she misses the teacher's instructions at the start of the day and the routine that the rest of the class are in, including valuable learning time. Your child may also feel embarrassed having to enter the classroom late or even worse into a whole school assembly. They will also have missed opportunities to chat with their friends before the school day be-

gins. Asking to collect your child early from school also means they are missing out on valuable teaching and learning time.

Minutes late per day during the school year	Equals days' worth of teaching lost in a year
5 Minutes	3.4 Days
10 Minutes	6.9 Days
15 Minutes	10.3 Days
20 Minutes	13.8 Days
30 Minutes	20.7 Days
